Because Hunger Doesn't Take a Weekend Off



EVALUATION AND TRANSPARENCY

As a not-for-profit organization, we have the responsibility to ensure the financial information we receive from our partners are accurate, as well as the financial implications matche our decisions and actions.



SACIF Charity's financial budget and audited reports operate from consolidated financial data from SACIF Volunteer Accountant team and gets discussed ,and approved by board of Directors.

- SACIF Charity prides itself on keeping its fundraising and administrative rate as low as possible. .
- Evaluation and Transparency is the key
- Self-evaluation can only take us so far, however. It takes unbiased outside experts to help an organization identify the fullest opportunities for growth and improvement.



EVALUATION AND ASSESSMENT

SACIF is using a new evaluation system:

Preparing professional questionnaire for evaluating the physical and mental status of sponsored children in Nepal, Afghanistan and Tanzania, to be filled out by pertinent responsible partners dealing with children.

The evaluation took place over a very condensed time period. The methodology pursued a number of lines of evidence, as follows:

- The evaluation measures the condition of sponsored child before the funds starts which include the physical and mental health, the living condition, family situation, education levels, financial needs, if they drop out of school and its reasons, and why they were chosen to be sponsored.
- Periodic evaluation that measured how the funds would help the child situation.
- If the funds taking into account the needs of children and their family.
- The evaluation report is collected by a new online tools.
